The Junior League of Fort Smith (JLFS) has been a part of the River Valley Community for over 60 years. We are made up of over 1000 women who are dedicated to our community and its growth. In 2013, JLFS began tailoring our efforts to address the foster care crisis in the Arkansas River Valley Community.

In 2018-2019, the Junior League of Fort Smith provided approximately 350 trained volunteers with 442 volunteer hours served! Our efforts impacted at least 830 citizens in our local community.

With your assistance, the Junior League of Fort Smith will continue acting as agents of social change! Your support will allow us to continue training women to be leaders in our community and will help us to prepare local foster teens for adult life as they age out of foster care.

Real Education and Development for Youth.

Skills-for-Life is a monthly life skills class offered to foster care teens ages 14-21. The classes often include topics such as: personal hygiene, peer pressure, stress, housing applications, college applications, job applications, basic finances, vehicle maintenance, and more! Each month, we work to provide an insightful speaker, fun activity, and free lunch - all of which are donated by our gracious sponsors, community partners, and volunteers.

Independent City is a real-life "game" filled with fun, prizes, and all of the surprises and challenges of real life. Hosted in the spring, this event is our year-end finale which allows our Skills-for-Life students to test what they have learned in their monthly classes. This one-day event provides foster teens with a fun way to learn about making smart life choices while getting hands-on experience with simulated life events, such as applying for a job, apartment hunting, buying a vehicle, grocery shopping, etc. They ultimately learn about choices available to them while in and out of the foster care system and how to prepare for independent adulthood.

JLFS Scholarship

The Junior League of Fort Smith Scholarship is a new project, founded in 2019, in which our members raise money to give foster teens much-needed financial support to attend college, vocational, or trade schools.

Presently, the most that a foster youth can be awarded from the State to attend college is \$10,920 a year. Most foster youth who go to college must still obtain student loans to make ends meet. The Junior League of Fort Smith's Scholarship aims to fill that gap for college-bound foster youth.

Our second annual JLFS scholarships were awarded in May of 2020. Five deserving students, who were previously in foster care, received a total of \$3,500 in scholarship funds for the upcoming school year.

Marble Hall | JLFS Headquarters

The Junior League of Fort Smith is headquartered at Marble Hall on historic Garrison Avenue in Fort Smith.

Built in 1859 by Ethelbert Britton Bright, Marble Hall is the oldest surviving building on Garrison. Judging from the surviving newspaper ads, Bright's mercantile store held the very wonders of the world, steadily supplied by steamboats docking at the foot of Garrison. In only two short years after it was built, the American Civil War broke

Marble Hall was soon pressed into service as a temporary hospital to care for wounded soldiers (both Union and Confederate). Following Bright's death in 1890, Marble Hall housed a shooting gallery.

Businesses thrived in Marble Hall up through the 1960's, when nationwide interests in downtowns gave way to malls. Marble Hall ultimately fell in disrepair and faced being condemned. Then, in 1977, Phil White took it upon himself to restore Marble Hall. Thanks to his hard work and the continued work of the Junior League in maintaining the building, Marble Hall is available for the generations to still enjoy.


